FATHER OF CONSERVATION

Did you know the "Father of Conservation" was the first chief of the U.S. Forests Service. Gifford Pinchot is credited for launching the conservation movement in the United States by encouraging Americans "to preserve the past in order to protect the future".

Pinchot traveled to learn forestry skills in a time when there were no degrees or even classes on the subject at any of the Universities. He graduated from Yale and then traveled to France where he first came up with his opinions on forestry. When he came back to the United States, he worked as a resident forester at Vanderbilt's Biltmore Forest Estate before he eventually found his way to the U.S. Department of Agriculture. He was named chief of the Division of Forestry. At this same time, his good friend, Theodore Roosevelt, was elected president. The management of forest reserves transferred from the Department of Interior to the Department of Agriculture, and the U.S. Forest Service was created. This new agency named Gifford Pinchot to be its first chief.

Pinchot who served just five years in office caused the United States to go from 60 national forests covering 56 million acres of forest reserves to 150 national forests units covering 172 million acres. After his time as chief, he continued his forestry services by helping to set up the Society of American Foresters. Pinchot is honored with a 1.6 million-acre national forest in Washington that bears his name.

What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

EPA considers some leftover household products that can <u>catch fire</u>, <u>react</u>, or <u>explode under certain circumstances</u>, or that are <u>corrosive</u> or <u>toxic</u> as household hazardous waste.

<u>Improper disposal</u> of HHW can include pouring them down the drain, on the ground, into storm sewers, or in some cases putting them out with the regular trash.
